

Event Guide of the 2022 Shikoku University Cup AJET Games touch rugby tournament

The 2022 Shikoku University Cup AJET Games touch rugby tournament will be held by Tokushima AJET along with Shikoku University and Tokushima touch association.

Date

Saturday & Sunday, June 4th & 5th, 2022

***Even if it rains, the tournament will take place as planned.**

Venue

Mino Kenko-Bosai Koen Ground (Mino-cho, Miyoshi-shi, Tokushima-ken)

Division

The main purpose of this touch rugby tournament is to promote mutual friendship among AJET members and international exchange with Japanese touch players through touch rugby. We would like every participating player to enjoy the sport regardless of their touch rugby experience, so we set up only the "ENJOY" Division in which friendly matches will be played. (We don't want any competitive teams that pursue only their own victories.)

We cannot accept as many teams as usual this year due to the pandemic. We will have to take countermeasures for COVID-19 as well as run the tournament. Therefore, we would like to limit the number of participating teams to around 15. Thank you for your understanding.

Team composition

This tournament is open to mixed teams of 6 playing members, with any number of substitutes. Teams may be composed of any combination of international and Japanese players, but there must be at least one female player on the field at any one time. If a team cannot play a female player, rather than being disqualified, that team must play with only 5 people on the field. [You can ask other teams for help.]

Competition format

To be announced. (According to the numbers of teams, competition format will be decided. Each team will play several 7 minute-half games during the tournament.)

Player's fee

3000 yen per person for two days (if you participate in the event only one day, the cost will be 1500 yen.) Supporters: No charge for admission

*Players' fees will be spent for participants' prizes, premium on insurance, rental fee for rugby fields, etc.

*We will stop accepting applications if the team limit is reached before the deadline.

Note

Please understand that should Japan's government issue the COVID-19 state of emergency or Tokushima prefectural government raise Tokushima Alert to Level 2, we have to cancel the tournament.

Prevention measures against new coronavirus infections

1. Registration

Participating teams must register the information (name, address, contact number, etc.) of all the team members (not only players but coaches, managers, and supporters) so that we can trace the cause should an infection be detected at this tournament.

If you want to replace or add team members, you can change the registration by the 20th of May. When you change the registration, you must register the info of new members as well as that of the members already registered. After the 20th of May, change of the registration will not be allowed because all the participants must check their health for the 14 days prior to the tournament according to the prevention measures against new coronavirus infections.

2. Checking the physical condition of participants

We sent team captains the spreadsheet for checking participant's health and every participant must record their physical condition such as daily temperature measurement for the 2 weeks prior to the tournament. On the day of the tournament, team captains must submit the papers for all the participants' regarding the condition of their health (we refer to these documents as "Health Check Sheet") at the reception. We ask all the participants to refrain from coming to the event if they are in poor condition.

*As for personal information, we practice strict information management and will only use your information when we need to check your health, judge whether you are able to join or not, or contact you. We will not provide your information to a third party without your permission unless the authorities demand it under the Personal Information Protection Law.

However, if the infection or suspected case of infection should be detected at the tournament, we may provide the necessary information to the local health center.

It is the responsibility of the team captain to ensure all information is true and correct.

3. COVID-19 vaccination / negative certificate


In addition to Health Check Sheet, we have to check COVID-19 vaccination (2nd dose) or negative certificates* (PCR / Antigen / Antibody test) of all the participants. We ask team captains to collect the image data of the certificates from your team members and email them to di072thewinger@hotmail.com in advance of the tournament.

*As for negative certificate, the test must be carried out within 72 hours until the tournament.

4. Wearing masks

During the tournament, please wear a mask at all times except during a warm-up or when you are participating in a game.

5. Hand hygiene

Alcohol disinfectant solution will be prepared for the tournament. Please disinfect your hands as needed especially:

- ★when entering the stadium (at the reception),
- ★before and after participating in a games,
- ★and after using the toilet.

6. Bringing your own drinks and towels

For infection prevention, please do not share drinks or towels with your teammates.

7. Other notes

In terms of infection prevention, please pay attention to the following items:

- ★Please do not spit on the Rugby Field.
- ★After games we usually shake hands as a mark of respect for the opponents. However, in this tournament please only touch your opponents with your fist or elbow instead of shaking hands.

- ★Please make sure to take your rubbish home with you after the tournament.
- ★When we ask you to do something related to infection prevention measures, please help and cooperate with us.

Other information

AJET teams

This tournament was originally established for promoting mutual friendship among the AJET members, and we prioritize applications from AJET teams over other groups. We also allocate cabins at Shikoku Saburo no Sato to AJET members on a priority basis. (1 cabin per team)

Basically, cabins at Shikoku Saburo no Sato will be allocated to AJET teams on a first-come-first-served basis. When you stay in a cabin at Shikoku Saburo no Sato, if your team has more than 7 participants, you have to book another accommodation, which means staying in the tents. Under the Fire Law in Japan one cabin there can hold up to 7 people. Whether you actually use tents or not, please book accommodations suitable for the number of people in your team.

When you stay in accommodation facility other than Shikoku Saburo no Sato, please book hotel rooms by yourself.

Definition of AJET teams: Team captains must be AJET members.

Non AJET teams: Teams consist of all Japanese players or their captains are not AJET members.

After the deadline for registration, if there are any cabins left at Shikoku Saburo no Sato, non AJET teams can book cabins on a first-come-first-served basis.

Note for lodgers

As countermeasures for COVID-19, Shikoku Saburo no Sato asks its lodgers to submit their Health Check Sheets and COVID-19 vaccination/negative certificates at the time of check-in. In order to make check-in procedure easier, we will share the health info of the lodgers with the facility. Please understand the usage of personal information like this.

In addition to submitting the health info, all the lodgers must check their temperature at the reception in the Center House when checking in. When your team receives temperature measurements, please make sure that all the team members gather at the reception.

The infection prevention (hand hygiene, wearing face masks, social distancing, etc.) of the lodgers is their responsibility. According to the prevention measures against novel coronavirus infections, we will not have a convivial party and offer a social cabin (D-10 cabin) where you can enjoy interacting with each other after 10:00 Saturday night this year. You can visit other teams' cabins, but when you interact with other teams, please be sure to take infection prevention measures.

Use of images

In this tournament, photographing and video filming will be conducted by the Tournament Organizers. Consequently, you may be photographed/filmed while you are at the venue. These images may be used as advertisements for Tokushima touch association and/or exposed/published on TV, newspapers, magazines and websites by news media after the event. Please be understanding of this beforehand.

Security

The security of your property is your responsibility. We will not be liable for any loss or damage to any of the valuables and or vehicles. Please ensure your vehicles are locked at all times when you are at the venue. BE WARNED events such as these attract thieves.

Medical treatment

For this tournament we have hired a doctor for safety management and ask him/her to consult and give emergency measures patients who get injured or have got health problem.

The doctor is waiting at the clubroom, should you get injured, please come and see him/her.

If the doctor diagnoses the damage beyond first-aid, we have to call 119. Please understand in advance.

Just in case, we recommend you bring your health insurance card with you.

Insurance

This tournament has taken out insurance for injury. Should anybody get injured and receive medical treatment in the hospital, please let us know.

Tents

Please bring your own tents/marquees to the rugby fields if you want to take a rest in the shade during the tournament. Mino Kenko-Bosai Koen Ground does not have such equipment. Sorry for inconvenience.

Weather

Even if we have rain, the tournament will be carried out as scheduled, but should we have an inclement weather such as a storm, heavy rain or thunderbolts, we, Organizers will be able to suspend or terminate the tournament at our discretion.

If we decide to resume the tournament after suspension, the tournament will be rescheduled by reducing the number of games or shortening game duration.

Force majeure

A) If Tournament Organizers are unable to perform, in whole or part in any obligation under these regulations of a Force Majeure Event, Tournament Organizers are relieved of that obligation under these regulations to the extent, and the period it is unable to perform.

B) In addition to A) Tournament Organizers have no obligation to refund to any individual or team any fees paid if it is unable to perform by reason of a Force Majeure Event.

FORCE MAJEURE EVENT: for the purposes of these regulations a force majeure event includes but is not limited to any or all of the following:

- Acts of God including flood (torrential rain), drought, earthquake, tsunami, storm, typhoon, fire, explosion, epidemic*; or
- War; or
- Terrorism; or
- Riot or civil disturbances; or
- Permanent injunction of any duly constituted court of competent jurisdiction; or
- Any fact, circumstance, matter or thing beyond the reasonable control of management.

*As for epidemic, a force majeure event is when the state of emergency is issued in Tokushima or Shikoku region and the tournament is prohibited by Tokushima government.
